Conference speakers



CAROLINE FARBERGER

Partner and Chairwoman, Wellstreet

Caroline has a long and successful career in the financial industry and she is the first senior business leader in the Nordics to speak openly about her gender transition. The experience of having been CEO from both a male and female position has given her a unique and eye-opening perspective on gender equality in the workplace. Caroline will emphasize why challenging norms, having inclusive leadership, and embracing diversity are key elements to obtain thriving organizations.

NIDDAL EL-JABRI

Client & Inclusive Strategist, Liberate Agency

For the past seven years, Niddal has been working in depth with understanding, representing, and communicating on behalf of minority groups. He will share his unique insights, and help the audience understand how to be relevant and how to design strategies for recruitment and communication that is inclusive and will be noticed and picked up by people, with minority identities.





SUSANNE KLATT

Division chief of training, Essen Fire Department

In 2006 Susanne co-founded Feuerwehrfrauen, the German network of female firefighters, where she has served as the president since 2022. She is also a board member of the CTIF Commission 'Women in Fire and Rescue Services'. At the center of this work, is the ambition to get more women into the fire services while also establishing equal opportunities for women already there.

Susanne will share insights and action points, as inspiration to others.

KARIN DANGERMOND

Senior researcher, Netherlands Institute for Public Safety

Karin will present her research based on group discussions, participant observations and interviews with more than 600 career and non-career firefighters. A reflection is given on diversity within the fire service; how firefighters think about diversity within the fire service and specifically in their station, and what opportunities and bottlenecks they experience. The role of firefighter humor is an important part of the culture - but is it also a mechanism to exclude firefighters who don't conform to the dominant norm at the station?





LOVELEEN RIHEL BRENNA

Founder and owner, Seema

Loveleen has extensive experience with diversity leadership and organizational development. She will highlight action points for working towards diverse and inclusive organizations and will cover different aspects of inclusive leadership, such as defining diversity, gender equality, inclusion, and belonging, and showing the links between diversity, value creation, sustainability, and risk reduction. Loveleen will emphasize why diversity management is about leadership and provide insights to understand diversity competence and its applicability.

BORIS GEORGIEV

Engagement Consultant, McKinsey & Company

Boris will present the importance of DEI and its value in organizations and showcase the highlights of McKinsey's global research findings. The gender diversity paradox and its root causes will be discussed and he will share knowledge on how to improve gender balance within organizations.





KENNETH REINICKE Associate Professor, Roskilde University

Kenneth is a prominent researcher on men and masculinity and for the past many years he has done research on different aspects of men's lives. Since the vast majority of Firefighters are men, his workshop will zoom in on how to understand men and masculinity in modern times and specifically on how the agenda of inclusion can be understood as being (also) beneficial to this particular group.



JENNIFER A. TAYLOR

Director, Center for Firefighter Injury Research and Safety Trends

Jennifer will present insights from an American context, where diversity, equity, and inclusion are considered critical, and explain the process of developing a specific toolkit, as a method to incorporate DEI strategies into the US fire service organizations. The toolkit includes education, assessment, training components. Through collected data, best practices, trainings and model policies are developed. The toolkit will be made available through an online clearing house to centralize information and will be free to all fire departments so that recruitment, retention, and advancement of a more diverse, equitable, and inclusive industry can be realized.





JANNICK FRIIS CHRISTENSEN

Ph.D., Postdoc researcher, Copenhagen Business School

Jannick's research focuses on norm-critical approaches to organizing and researching diversity. He will focus on LGBT inclusion and how our biases can influence recruitment and work culture, and potentially affect the wish for a diverse workforce. Shifting the perspective from individual to organizational bias, he will emphasize how to approach bias on a structural level, that opens up organizations to those outside the traditional norm.

LENA GRIP / STEFAN KARLSSON

Researchers, Karlstad University, Sweden

Lena Grip and Stefan Karlsson have focused on gender equality and diversity within the Rescue Services in several studies. In their presentation, they will highlight lessons from these studies - in particular, questions about the working environment and the organization of the work. It will be pointed out, how equality and diversity work is strengthened when broad and systematic work environment management is put in focus. Improving gender equality is about changing attitudes, but not only; it is also about changing structures.
