Technical Assistance for Disaster Risk Management ('Track 1')

Technical Assistance Financing Facility (TAFF)

Knowledge for Action in Prevention and Preparedness (KAPP)

- Single country grants for national civil protection or DRM authorities
- Open scope of proposals supporting the implementation of national DRM priorities
- Project implementation and reporting by the beneficiary
- In charge of your own procurement of expertise
- 95% EU co-financing

- Single country support for national civil protection or DRM authorities
- Fully executed by the World Bank (turnkey project) in pre-identified areas
- No direct funding to the beneficiary organisations – implementation and reporting done by the World Bank
- Experts selected by the World Bank, no contracting by beneficiary
- 100 % EU financed

- Multi-country project grants
 (consortia of public or private
 entities, including one authority
 with CP/DRM competences)
- UCPM-relevance (applicability beyond the consortia countries)
- Implementation and reporting by Consortium
- In charge of your own procurement of expertise
- 90 % EU co-financed

Main changes (to be confirmed):

- **Possibility of consortia** of relevant entities led by national authorities
- Key Performance Indicators
- Key words to be selected in the application

Focus on national DRM capacity development & priorities remain largely untouched



Technical Assistance Financing Facility (TAFF)

Timeline (to be confirmed):

- Launch of the Call for Expression of Interest (EoI):
 End of January 2025
- Info Day: 4 February 2025
- Deadline for submission: Mid-March 2025
- Shortlist of approved projects: Early May 2025
- WB develops full proposal/scope of activities in consultation with counterparts: May-June 2025
- Start of projects: June 2025 onwards

Budget: EUR 3 million (to be confirmed)

Main changes:

- EOI template remains the same with small changes envisioned to clarify eligible entities & implementation arrangements
- EOI submission: strongly recommended to consult with World Bank team to ensure eligibility, prior to submission




The inclusion of at least one national civil protection or disaster risk management authority in the consortia should be mandatory

Proposals that involve civil protection or disaster risk management authorities in their formulation should receive more points than proposals that do not involve these authorities


The connections between KAPP projects and civil protection or disaster risk management authorities are sufficient under the current call design


To provide the letter of support of the national civil protection authority of your country, do you have a structured procedure in place in your organisation?


Would you agree that the KAPP call topics and priorities remain aligned with the EU Disaster Resilience Goals (DRGs)?




DRG 1. Anticipate -Improving risk assessment, anticipation, and disaster risk management planning

DRG 5. Secure -Ensuring a robust civil protection system


DRG 3. Alert -Enhancing early warning
