






Immediate response





A Muslim Paramedic:

We treated a very seriously injured women, who told us — "I'm going to die, leave me and save yourself".

We brought her alive to the hospital.

I was sure I'm going to die that day. I called my father in law, told him I love them and asked that he takes care of my children.

Then, I went to the ambulance, and immediately back to the scene.



Primary care point in MDA stations






The figures of Oct. 7th-



- Casualties (IDF spokesperson) :
 - More than 1'250 killed (final number to be determined, difficult identification)
 - 1'600 injured (350 in critical condition)
 - Kidnapped 239 confirmed (more uncounted for)
 - 7 MDA members killed, 2 seriously injured, 2 with minor injuries.
- 9 ambulances damaged
- More than 20'000 calls to MDA emergency number (101)





Emergency Dispatch Center

Injuries and Lessons Observed



- Penetrating gunshot wounds (extremities, torso, abdomen, head)
- Blast injuries (RPG)
- Burns and smoke inhalation

Main treatment challenges:

- No access to patients, prolonged time between injury and care
- Prolonged use of tourniquets, patient in deep hemorrhagic shock
- Massive evacuation by bystanders / security forces, no triage
- Often due to security and safety considerations, "scoop & run" of more than 1 critical patient, with very little care was the only option

Injuries and Lessons Observed – contd.




- "Stop the bleed" training and CAT saved lives (especially among military/police personnel)
- Tranexamic Acid and FDP key elements in care
- Need for "tourniquet conversion"
- Patients with severe bleeding survived beyond "golden hour"
- Good compliance of the general public to "stop the bleed" instructions by call takers
- Primary distribution of patients?

Main operational Challenges



- Understanding the magnitude of the incident (what's next?)
- Creating a common operational picture
- Ensuring security of personnel
- Communities under attack (no access) ad-hock victims collection points, MAGEN teams.
- Use of the Mega Causality response capacities
- New situation for call takers (hide in place, no response sent) / dispatchers
- Psychosocial support for responders
- Personnel who are evacuees
