

### Definitions

### Inclusiveness under the UCPM

**Equality:** Providing the same resources and treatment to everyone, treating everyone in the same way regardless of their individual or particular needs.


**Vulnerable groups:** Life circumstances (e.g. poverty, education) and/or discrimination based on physical or social characteristic (sex, disability, age, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, etc.) reducing the ability of primary stakeholders (for example, individuals/ households/community) to withstand adverse impact from external stressors. Vulnerability is not a fixed criterion attached to specific categories of people, and **no one is born vulnerable per se.** 





# Intro: Reality at a glance


#### Inclusiveness under the UCPM



Yet, only one country in the EU commits to allocation of state budget for disability-inclusive civil protection measures, which indicates a major gap in national investments and efforts for inclusive DRR.

#### Women are disproportionately more affected by disasters than men,

especially those who live in vulnerable situations. According to the <u>OECD</u> estimates that women and children are 14 times more likely to die from a disaster than men.





# UCPM funding programmes

Inclusiveness under the UCPM

Over the period 2014-2024, UCPM has co-funded 23 cross-border projects which had some 'vulnerable groups component', for a total EU support of cca EUR 11.5 million.

An example are the 2021 and 2023 projects Safe and Equal in EMErgencies (SEE ME), and its sequel, SEE ME 2, and which aims to contribute to equal opportunities for persons with disabilities in emergency situations.





# Awareness raising

# Inclusion in Civil Protection capacities

### Inclusiveness under the UCPM







Example: 15% of rescEU shelter capacity should be accessible to people with some form of disability

Accessible shelter units and tents, WASH units, eating spaces, infirmary

**Example**: taking into account the needs of vulnerable groups

- Availability of child-friendly spaces
- Tailored hygiene kits
- Safe and lockable WASH units

Best practice: In the case of the Swedish rescEU shelter capacity, gender field expert will be deployed with the capacities and attention is paid to recruiting staff composed of men and women.



## ERCC operations and exercises

### Inclusiveness under the UCPM

The **ERCC** has successfully coordinated several **evacuations** of people with physical and mental disabilities ensuring a **safe transfer of patients** to other countries.

**Example**: in the current context of Russia's invasion of Ukraine, the ERCC evacuated a group of **110 Ukrainian psychiatric** patients through the UCPM







The needs of people with disabilities and other vulnerable groups have always been considered in exercise scenarios among the main goals and were evaluated during training and exercise activities.

- EU MODEX for water related modules, organized in Austria (*November 2024*), where people with mental or physical disabilities as well as elderly were trapped on the island of the Mura river and had to be evacuated.
- EU MODEX in Portugal (*January 2025*), the scenario included evacuation of numerous patients form a collapsed hospital (earthquake scenario). The victims included pregnant women, children and the elderly.






#### Inclusiveness under the UCPM



**Enhancing inclusiveness** as a key horizontal principle for disaster risk management, set out in the first Commission Recommendation on **Union Disaster Resilience Goals** adopted in February 2023.
