There are more than 900,000 People with Disabilities (PwDs) living in Romania

79% believe they would face significant challenges or would be unable to

79% believe they would face significant challenges or would be unable to evacuate their homes on their own in the event of a disaster.



[Pilot] Trainings on adapting emergency response interventions to the needs of PwDs

2023 – 2024 GFDRR Japanese TF

- 500+ first responders trained on how to interact with people with disabilities in disaster situations;
- 1 Training-of-Trainers
- Training curriculum and course materials developed with WB support, which are now being used by first responders in their training activities.

Scaling up at national level with TAFF support

2025 - 2026 **EU TAFF**

Firefighters from all intervention units across the country will have attended a training course focused on how to interact with people with disabilities;



Expected Results

Addressing Gender Based Violence (GBV) during emergency situations interventions

Romania has high rates of GBV, physical and/or sexual violence, and harassment of women.

Disaster situations could further increase these risks.

Input

Trainings for first responders on how to identify GBV cases and employ effective referral mechanisms to link GBV survivors with essential services

1. Improved identification of GBV cases

-> Better equipped responders, increased awareness, and reduced secondary victimization.

2. Strengthened Referral Pathways

-> Better coordination between police, healthcare, shelters, and legal services.

3. Increased Trust in Emergency Services

-> Encourages more survivors to seek help and reduces stigma around reporting

4. Enhanced Support for Survivors

-> Better coordination between first responders, police, healthcare, social protection agencies
