






Strengthening wildfire prevention and risk assessment

- Duration: 24 months (Nov 23 Nov 26)
- Challenge: wildfire season of 2022
- Objectives:
 - Strategic assessment
 - Wildfire risk methodology
 - Communication and awareness raising activities
 - Capacity building





Coastal Protection Strategy

- Beneficiary Authorities: Public Works Department of the Maltese Ministry for Public Works and Planning (MPWP) and the Malta Tourism Authority (MTA)
- Duration: 27 months (Sep 21 Dec 23)
- Challenge: increasing pressure on the coast, faster erosion rates and lack of strategic approach to address the increasing risk to people and property
- Objectives:
 - Assessment of coastal risks, hazards and vulnerabilities
 - National Coastal Protection and Adaptation Strategy
- Project highlights: video






- Beneficiary Authority: Comune di Roma Capitale
- Duration: 20 months (July 24 March 26)
- Challenge: lack of a comprehensive strategy to address the urban heat island (UHI) effect, despite its intense effect in Rome,
- Objectives:
 - Mapping the UHI risk in Rome
 - Action Plans for two pilot areas
 - Practical intervention manual
 - Capacity building
