The legal bases

Article 2 of the Treaty on European Union (TEU) highlights solidarity as one of the principles key to the Union. The principle of solidarity is also referred to in Article 21(1) TEU as one of the foundations of the Union's external action.

Art. 214.5 Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union: In order to establish a framework for joint contributions from young Europeans to the humanitarian aid operations of the Union, a European Voluntary Humanitarian Aid Corps shall be set up.

Volunteering Projects offer opportunities for young people to take part in solidarity activities contributing to the daily work of participating organisations, to the ultimate benefit of the communities within which the activities are carried out.









Volunteering Projects

Individual volunteering allows young people to participate in the daily activities of organisations for **2-12 months** (in cases for people with fewer opportunities as of 2 weeks) abroad or in their country of residence.



Minimum two organisations covering host and support role (except for in-country and volunteering teams) and holder of a **Quality Label**.



Volunteering teams are groups of **10-40** young people from at least **two countries** volunteering for a shorter period of **2 weeks to 2 months**.





GEOGRAPHICAL SCOPE

EU Member States and third countries associated to the programme: - Organisations can apply to the National Agency of the country they are established in.



Third countries not associated to the programme – Organisations can participate in projects as partners.





Volunteering Teams in High Priority Areas

The projects focus on **short-term group volunteering** large scale, **high impact projects.**

An incentive for youngsters who do not feel ready to embark upon challenging experiences on their own or **cannot commit for a long period of time** because of their studies or jobs, but still want to be of help for the community.

For livelihoods and communities that have been disrupted by **natural** or **man-made disasters**, including **armed conflicts**,

the **Commission** since 2023 has proposed to put <u>"relief for persons fleeing armed conflict</u> and other victims of natural or man-made <u>disasters"</u> as a **specific priority**







GEOGRAPHICAL SCOPE

EU Member States, third countries associated/ not
associated to the programme

Organisations minimum 3 from two EU Member States or third countries associated to the programme.



CONDITIONS

Project duration 1, 2 or 3 years

Unit costs (max. EUR 400.000 per project

Teams of min. 5 participants from different countries (one project min. 40 participants)

Duration between 2 weeks and 2 months

Quality Label is required



Humanitarian Aid volunteering



Geographical scope: World-wide outside of EU Member States and countries associated to the programme

Duration: As an individual: 2 to 12 months, or in teams of 5 to 40 participants during 15 to 60 days

Requirement: Completion of the compulsory training (online and face-to-face)

Quality Label: Required, delivered by EACEA







Humanitarian Aid volunteering activities in support of humanitarian aid operations contribute to projects that:

facilitate the transition from the humanitarian response to long-term su stainable and inclusive development

contribute to **strengthening the capacity and resilience** of vulnerable or di saster-affected communities

reinforce disaster preparedness and disaster risk reduction


link relief, rehabilitation and development

ensure a **high level of safety and security** for volunteers






Volunteering in support of humanitarian aid operations







Geographical scope: projects 2022 to 2024



The Quality Label

QUAL**Entry ticket** for organisations,

precondition for participation in volunteering activities, to apply for funding and take part in the programme

Organisations must demonstrate compliance with quality standards and objectives of the Corps and Capacity to undertake quality volunteering activities





2 types of Quality Labels, awarded by **National Agencies** for volunteering projects and by the **EACEA** for humanitarian aid volunteering projects

Valid until 2027 and subject to periodical reassessments, it does NOT automatically lead to funding





The Quality Label ensures compliance with the principles & quality standards of the Corps

Equal opportunities and non-discrimination

Avoidance of job substitution

Avoidance of harmful activities

Provision of high quality, easily accessible and inclusive activities

Adequate training, working and volunteering arrangements

For volunteering in solidarity activities: applications should be made at one of the National Agencies

You can use the <u>application forms</u> (ESC50) to apply for a Quality Label at any time. National Agencies take about 8 weeks to process applications.

The Quality Label will give your organisation access to the Organisation Portal, accessible from the European Solidarity Corps portal.




NB: A Quality Label is **not** needed for Solidarity Projects.
