1. Introduction

During the project lifetime, from 1 February 2024 to 31 January 2026, the FIREPRIME consortium actively carried out dissemination activities aimed at making project results available and enabling their uptake by the project's key stakeholders, including the scientific community, emergency services, policymakers, and other EU-funded projects. Scientific publications and presentations delivered in scientific forums have played a central role in disseminating the project and its outcomes.

Equally important were dissemination efforts targeting policymakers and operational stakeholders, implemented through participation in expert meetings and the organisation of dedicated workshops. These activities enabled direct engagement with emergency services, policymakers and residents of wildland–urban interface (WUI) communities, allowing the consortium to understand firsthand their concerns and needs. This participatory approach supported the co-creation of practical and user-oriented resources—most notably the FIREPRIME app—designed to strengthen community preparedness in the face of wildfire risk.

In addition, this report includes planned participation in conferences and forthcoming publications to be delivered and published in the coming months. This demonstrates the consortium's commitment to continued dissemination the project's methodology and results beyond the project's completion.

Abstract	<p>Wildfire risk to critical infrastructure is an increasing concern as wildfire frequency and intensity continue to rise. Existing research has focused primarily on electrical infrastructure and watershed contamination, leaving other infrastructure sectors comparatively understudied. In this systematic literature review, we analyse which types of infrastructure have been examined and summarise the methodologies used to characterise wildfire hazard, exposure, and vulnerability across power, water, transport, and highly hazardous industrial infrastructure. This review provides a consolidation of state-of-the-art approaches in critical infrastructure wildfire risk analysis. Key gaps identified include lack of hazard characterisations of non-flame wildfire hazards (smoke and firebrands), limited and asset-focused physical vulnerability analysis and related damage thresholds, poor linkage between regional hazard mapping and the near-absence critical infrastructure interdependencies consideration. These gaps directly motivate methodological synergies. For instance, detailed thermal and vulnerability modelling developed for water distribution pipes can be transferred to similar components in other sectors. Dynamic wildfire and smoke models for power and hazardous industrial infrastructure can be extended to sectors currently using static or occurrence-based metrics and publicly produced regional hazard products could be integrated with sector-specific exposure and vulnerability models to create consistent, multi-scale risk assessments. By systematically comparing risk characterisation approaches across sectors, this review highlights that critical infrastructure systems share sufficient commonalities, vulnerability mechanisms, and spatial scales to enable transfer and adaptation of wildfire risk assessment methodologies. Coordinated development and sharing of hazard, exposure, and vulnerability characterisation tools across sectors would substantially improve the assessment and management of wildfire risk to critical infrastructure.</p>

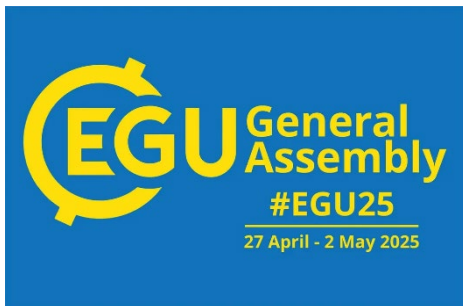
